# Museum Ambassador's Report

Well, 2021 has passed and most, if not all, of us have been touched by COVID in the last 21 months. The COVID cloud still hangs over our world and in the last month of 2021 a string of tornados cut a path of destruction across the heartland of our country bringing even more death and destruction. Our hearts go out to all of the victims of the storms and their families as they are recovering from the damage incurred on December 11<sup>th</sup> and afterwards.

The NCM, Motorsports Park and the GM Assembly Plant in Bowling Green found themselves in the paths of the storms also. While the Museum itself sustained only minimal damage, the Motorsports Park was not so lucky. Several buildings sustained major damage with roofs being ripped off. The Museum was only closed over the weekend after the storms due to power outages and debris in the roads. Museum officials have verified that all vehicles and artifacts are safe and secure. The Motorsports Park is not safe for visitors and all activities are currently suspended until further notice.

The GM Assembly Plant received the worst damage. While the Museum has made no comment as to the extent of the damage, news reports have shown substantial roof damage in certain areas of the plant, fire damage as a result of the storms, and some 115 near- complete 2022 Corvettes, still on the assembly line, that will now go to the crusher because of water damage! Re-orders for these cars will now, reportedly, be shuffled back into the current order stream for production. Local dealers will contact owners and work out details.

The NCM has been working hard in 2021 as is evidenced by the number of awards they have received from various organizations. They have received awards for their educational programs, online content, exhibits, creativity, community impact, marketing, community support and engagement and more. Thanks to all the leaders and staff that have worked so hard to bring all of this recognition to the Museum.

The first big event for the Museum in 2022 will be the annual NCM Bash that will be held April 28 - 30 on the grounds of the Museum. A 2022 Artic White Stingray will be raffled off that weekend as a part of the event. Ticket prices are only \$20.00 and there is no limit on the number of tickets to be sold for this car.

September 1 – 3, 2022 will mark the 28<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration for the Museum.

As always, remember the raffles!! The first two raffles for 2022 are as follows. On January 13<sup>th</sup> a 2022 Black Stingray Coupe will be raffled off. Ticket prices are \$100.00 each and a total of 2,000 tickets are available for sale. As of this writing there are 1,255 tickets still available. Then, on February 3<sup>rd</sup>, a 2022 "Build Your Own" Corvette will be raffled off, or your choice of \$70,000.00 in cash. Ticket prices are \$250.00 each and a maximum of 1,500 tickets will be sold. As of this writing there are 1,394 tickets still available.

That is all for now, let's work to make 2022 a much better year for us all!

## **Technical Article**


#### LAZY RUNNING SMALL BLOCKS – CAN'T FIND THE REASON? A LITTLE KNOWN FACT

You finally found your new classic Corvette: the engine looks right, the pad looks good, but you can't get the performance the 283-327 should have. It runs *I a z y ! When cruising* at 55 one cylinder will fire approximately 1100 times in one minute, or, 18 times a second. Also, the spark plug will fire at 8,500° -11,000°F to ignite the air-fuel and BOOM!

Ignition timing is tough to understand but easy to adjust. Here is a long reach problem about which little is known. We all adjust the timing using the Harmonic Balance (HB) and the timing tab. The HB's in the 50's and 60's were all manufactured with the Woodruff Key almost aligned with the timing mark on the HB. About the time General Motors dropped the small journal crank in late 1968-1969 they moved the mark on the HB approximately 12 degrees retarded from the key position. Since then most manufacturers used that setting on their new HB's.

The new HB's will fit the old cranks. An easy check: use a screwdriver and check your Dead Top Center (DTC) with the HB. That could be the problem. 10-12 degrees makes a *lazy* engine and surely makes the engine run hotter. That is not good with unleaded gas.
