Judging Chairman's Report

Our SE NCRS Spring Meet was held in conjunction with the Corvette EXPO in Pigeon Forge, Tenn. on Friday and Saturday, March 14 and 15. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank our hosts, H&J Promotions, for accommodating our event and for providing us with a prime corner location complete with a continuous red drapery backdrop showcasing our area. This highly visible location afforded us better exposure within the EXPO, and we had a first-class display area for our seven Flight-judged cars. The feedback received from participants has been more than positive.

Patrons of the Corvette EXPO were able to observe NCRS Flight Judging from the aisle for general attendees just outside the cordoned off judging area. Quite a few had questions about NCRS judging, membership and chapter membership. Our SE membership manager, Marianne Landis, and Chris Henry, did a fine job of answering questions, recruiting new members and directing patrons to the NCRS store.



In addition to our Flight and Sportsman cars, we had an inside display with four cars and a chassis. Technical Articles

C-2 & C-3 Simple and Easy Way to Replace Rivets on Lower Ball Joints



If you want to do this yourself, it is an easy procedure with this jig set-up. If the rivet hole has not been drilled out and the new rivet fits right, set up the jig as shown. If the rivet holes have been drilled out to 3/8 bolts, you can MIG weld a circle, grind the weld and redrill to the rivet size.



Tighten the clamp as if you want to break something (very tight) and proceed with the air impact tool. You have to keep the impact straight to get the right mushroom effect. Heating the tip on the rivet to red really makes it easy. You can create the mushroom with a hammer and set tool to have more control.

Corvette Maintenance Checklist from the American Muscle Car Museum

At the January Florida Regional meet held at the American Muscle Car Museum in Melbourne Florida, I met Ed Dedick and asked if he would share his Maintenance Checklist they use at the museum and he was happy to provide it. The attached checklist is detailed and can be a great tool for both an initial or annual review of the many areas of interest when maintaining your Corvette.

The check list has 160+ line items to review with the following sections:

- Pre-start and under hood
- Performance drivability
- Post drive and assessment
- Cleaning and detailing

The check list is an Excel spreadsheet that makes it easy to update line items, add a column for each year and add / delete lines. In addition, you can add lines of sections to suit your needs.

Suggested uses include:

- An initial assessment of a new purchase or project car
- An annual assessment and refresh of fluids
- Preparation for winter storage or spring operation
- To track repairs that have been made or need attention
- For future projects and listing required parts.
